Then it was on to Portland working with developmentally disabled adults and learning about herself. Later she ended up at Northern Arizona University where she received a double major in elementary education and in special education. There her fire for education and equity was lit. Lily taught 5th & 6th grade in central Phoenix for 7 years, then became an instructional coach for middle school teachers at an inner city school of 1,600 students. These 15 years in Phoenix were integral to her development as an educator.

It was Lily's honor to serve her teachers and students for the last 8 years as organizer and advocate. Supporting the most marginalized students and their teachers has been her life's work.

Lily's greatest pride and joy is her 20 year old son, Liam, who is currently a junior at Oregon State University. Lily finds her daily happiness exploring nature with her rescue pups, Atticus and Olive Oyl, attending yoga classes, and reading and learning as much as possible while she's on this beautiful planet. Finally, after 30 years, Lily has incredible gratitude to have returned to this community that raised her so well. It indeed did take an entire village. She is also eager to get to know everyone in the Salish Sea Fellowship and to learn how to serve this group to the best of her abilities.
