
We meet in-person at the Community United Methodist Church (CUMC) in Port Hadlock, 130 Church Lane.

#### 4th Sunday Gathering Ideas:


We are looking to generate ideas of ways for us to gather together in community during the 4th Sunday of the month. All ideas are welcome!

The first **Annual Meeting** of the **Salish Sea Fellowship** was held on **December 8, 2024**. About **80% of our members** were present either in person or on Zoom! As a result, the Membership has elected the following Members to the Board of Directors:

- Judy King (currently Treasurer),
- Gary Nelson (currently Treasurer),
- Nils Pedersen (currently President),
- Brian Rogers (new Member of the Board),
- Ron Strange (currently Member at Large), and
- Rob Wamstad (currently Vice-President).

Each member is elected for a two-year term. The Board officers will be chosen by the Board itself. The Board expresses its gratitude to the Membership for its participation in the meeting and its trust in the newly elected Board.

The Annual Meeting also approved a **budget for 2025**, which may be found <u>HERE</u>. As Rob noted in the meeting, we included no reserve in the budget as we are very likely to conclude 2025 with a surplus. Forms were also handed out at the meeting for all to make their **pledge of contributions** toward the budget. If you did not get the form at the meeting, you can find it <u>HERE</u>. We hope for all pledge forms to be returned by the end of the current year; your contribution toward your pledge may be made later. At the meeting, **we also decided to move our Sunday Services to 2pm in January and February**, *assuming that works for our speakers of course* (we have not heard back from all of them yet). Also, in the summer we will go to a lighter schedule, with one service only and a community event (e.g. picnic or potluck) in each of July and August. The Annual Meeting was asked to be moved to a pre-holiday time; we will aim for the 2nd Sunday in November to give good time before Thanksgiving.







Salish Sea Fellowship volunteers will provide soup and meal assistance at the Community United Methodist Church (CUMC) soup kitchen on **December 21st**, and the **third Saturday of future months**. We need two folks to each deliver a gallon of soup (which you can make at home) to the church by 9:45. One soup needs to be veggie and the other can have meat. The church has crockpots to borrow, or you can bring soup in your own pot and transfer it or keep it warm on the stove. Help with set-up, serving, and clean-up is also valuable. Lori Oberlander of CUMC will be on hand to show volunteers what's needed.
