#### February NAUA Academy Recording: "Boom or Doom: Is Unleashing Artificial Intelligence Wise?" with Ken Ing



#### A Community Offering

Beginning with our last service, we have decided to change the offering to a Community Offering in support of organizations doing good work in our community, and the entire offering not designated otherwise was donated to JCIRA (jcira.org). We have done so because we can, because you, our Membership, readily pledged beyond our goal for 2025. Thank you! This brings up a couple of things.

First, as we want our donations to go to groups that we the Membership believe are doing good work in our community, please send us your suggestions for such organizations by email to <u>salishseafellowship@gmail.com</u>. Please make sure that these groups are local non-profit organizations with 501(c)(3) status.

Second, if you want to put money in the collection plate for any reason other than the Community Offering being supported on a particular Sunday (e.g. your pledge) you can do so by: 1. write a check including instructions on where the money should go, or 2. If you want to give cash, place it in one of the provided envelopes and write your name and instructions on the envelope. This allows us to credit you in our records.



#### North American Unitarian Association:

At a recent meeting, your Board of Directors began to consider the idea of joining the North American Unitarian Association (NAUA, <u>naunitarians.org</u>). Given our history, some of us may be hesitant to join any association; at this point it seems we value our independence. The NAUA states on its homepage that it is there to help liberal religion thrive, and that it 'is a member service organization dedicated to supporting and promoting the practice of liberal religion by embracing freedom, reason, and tolerance—rooted in our commitment to the inherent worth and dignity of every person and all peoples.' We also realize that the SSF is the largest 'breakaway' congregation, and our joining the NAUA, beyond making a statement, would also put us in a position to help other smaller congregations deal with the various issues and complexities involved in running a congregation. In any case, we as a board feel that any decision in this regard should be made by the membership as a whole, and so we would ask you to begin learning about the NAUA.


### CALLIGRAPHER WANTED
